Phi Beta Kappa was founded on December 5, 1776, at the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia, and has championed education in the liberal arts and sciences for nearly a quarter of a millennium. The Phi Beta Kappa Society currently has 290 university chapters and nearly 50 alumni associations, including the Puget Sound Association of Phi Beta Kappa. PSA-PBK was founded in 1953 by Phi Beta Kappa members at the University of Washington and in the Seattle community. For over 65 years, we have been committed to recognizing academic excellence via our undergraduate and graduate scholarships and high school book awards. We also recognize community leaders through our Pathfinder Awards and our Humanities Achievement Awards.

We routinely offer cultural, educational, and social events for our members and their guests. We had anticipated having member events this spring, including our annual spring luncheon. However, due to the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic and the need for social distancing, we have had to postpone our events until later this year.

Several museums in the Seattle area are offering virtual tours of their exhibits that you can view at home on your electronic devices. ### **Lupton Scholarship**

Myra Lupton, a long-time member of PSA-PBK, passed away on March 31, 2019. She was active in the leadership of several professional and community organizations, including the League of Women Voters, Youth and Family Services of Mercer Island, and Friends of Luther Burbank Park. She was on the board of trustees of PSA-PBK for over 40 years, including serving as president of our association.

Following her graduation from the University of Washington with a double major in zoology and English, she spent 31 years as an English teacher at Sammamish High School in Bellevue. Her support for education was evident in the decision she and her family made to commit \$50,000 of her estate to the scholar-ship program of PSA-PBK. This money, along with \$7,000 contributed over this past year by our PSA-PBK members, will permit us to establish an endowed undergraduate scholarship in her name.

This Myra Lupton Undergraduate Scholarship will begin at the \$3,000 level. The scholarship amount is expected to increase with inflation over the years and will be used to support students who are the first generation in their family to attend college.

Emily Rathburn, a senior at the University of Puget Sound, is the first recipient of the Lupton Scholarship. Rathburn is a psychology major who plans a career in elementary education. In her application essay, she wrote "During my years at [UPS] I found a love for the challenge of the curriculum. Every day I arrive on campus, I feel greater motivation to accomplish this dream of receiving deep and enriching instruction." Congratulations to her for her accomplishments and commitment to education.

### **High School Book Awards**

In early February we announced our 2020 High School Book Awards, and some schools have responded and selected a graduating senior to receive a book. This award recognizes academic excellence and introduces graduating seniors to Phi Beta Kappa's core values of knowledge, wisdom, intellectual honesty, broad interests, trust, integrity, and responsibility. An essential part of the initial planning for the Puget Sound Association of Phi Beta Kappa in 1952 was the awarding of book prizes to selected high school students to encourage a love of learning.

Your annual dues and contributions fund our high school book awards as well as our Pathfinder Awards, scholarships, and member events.


#### **Pathfinder Awards**

Each spring we honor individuals, organizations, or institutions with our Pathfinder Award. The award reflects the imagery on the Phi Beta Kappa key — a hand pointing to the stars. It honors those who encourage others to seek new worlds to discover, pathways to explore, and untouched destinations to reach. This year we will be honoring three organizations with our Pathfinder Awards.

**Hopelink,** for its education services. This includes two programs: English for Work (which helps immigrants and refugees improve their English skills and prepare for employment in the U.S.) and GED/High School+ classes (which help prepare students to earn their GED or high school diploma).

**Path with Art.** This organization works with people recovering from homelessness, addiction, and other traumas by "harnessing the power of creative engagement as a bridge to community and a path to stability." This includes such things as art classes, playing music at a jam session, visiting the Seattle Symphony, and other similar creative events.

**AAUW**, for its Tech Trek Program. In this program girls in middle school (the age when girls' participation in these fields statistically drops) spend a week in a summer camp experiencing hands-on problem solving and encounters with women role models in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). The goal is to "help girls see their future while having nonstop fun." The program is "backed by AAUW's research and designed to make STEM fields exciting and accessible to girls in middle school."
